



KNOW WHERE TO GO TO GET CARE

Where you choose to go for health care can affect your costs. The good news is that our plans provide a lot of options. The first thing you should do is plan to use an in-network provider. Begin your search by calling the number on the back of your medical ID card, or visiting your health plan provider's website.

The chart below highlights the options available to you when you need care and can't see your Primary Care Physician (PCP).
